

TOWN OF BRANCHVILLE
SPECIAL COUNCIL MINUTES
FEBRUARY 25, 2013

PRESIDING: MAYOR GLENN MILLER

Mayor Miller called the meeting to order, all stood for the Pledge of Allegiance and prayer was given by Councilman Tom Jennings.

Mayor Miller gave Roll Call for Council all Council was present except Councilman Robert Berry.

Mayor Miller asked council what should be done about one of the maintenance utility trucks. The oil pump went bad on it and the warranty expired in August. The estimated cost for repair is \$1,700.

Councilman Sam Whisenhunt expressed that he would feel better if whoever fixed the utility truck gave us a warranty. It was recommended to take the truck to Bilton Ford in St. George from where it was purchased.

Mayor Miller said that on Wednesday Pump Station #6 was turned off and Pump Station #2 does not work. He also mentioned that Pump Stations 5 and 6 needs to have propellers change out and that each well is started daily.

Mayor Miller gave a run down on the New Town Hall. Mayor Miller said that all fire extinguishers, pews and doorways were complete. He feels that the doors are the biggest worry right now because all interior door hinges has to be changed out. Councilman Sam Whisenhunt said that he would call Harry Wiggins, the building inspector, to check on the situation of the doors.

Mayor Miller reported that he was waiting for a bid for the town hall railings from Donald Valentine. He stated that \$400 was the most that he would be willing to pay. Mayor Miller said that if the bid is too high that he would do the work himself.

The signage to go on the Town Hall was discussed. Mayor and Council agreed that they wanted the sign to read TOWN OF BRANCHVILLE, not just Branchville.

Mayor Miller said that William would be coming to the March Council meeting in order to answer question regarding the proposed FEMA building.

Mayor Miller said that the next day he would be contacting Bill Clark in order to get money back for the building of the town hall.

Mayor Miller reported that someone had called DEHEC. He stated that he faxed them all the paperwork that they needed and that everything was fine.

Mayor Miller said that from now on all contractors would need to schedule in advance with town hall in order to have any water lines marked.

Motion was made, seconded and approved for meeting to adjourn.
